HAVE YOU EXPERIENCED ANY OF THESE PROBLEMS AT THE SALVATION ARMY OR ANOTHER RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT PROGRAM?

- ⇒ Denied access to medication for Opioid Use Disorder – methadone, buprenorphine (e.g., Suboxone, Subutex), or naltrexone (Vivitrol)
- ⇒ Rejected from or kicked out of residential treatment for participating in medication for opioid use disorder
